
PILE UP

PRINTING INSTRUCTIONS PER PARTICIPANT:

- 1 plain paper copy each page
- 1 2 sided copy of pages 2 & 3 on card stock
- weight prefer shade of green if possible
- 1 copy of page 4 on white card stock

PREPARATIONS:


Write various vocabulary words on craft sticks. (See list) Color point chart the 4 different colors of the sticks in play. Add colored point dots to sticks if using plain wooden sticks. Place in container. Add a die. **GAME:**

Drop all sticks randomly on floor/table. First student rolls die. A roll of 3 on die, student has 3 chances to successfully remove a stick. (Variation, student may attempt to pick up 3 sticks) Once a student has removed a stick they must read the word. Next they sort the word into the correct category on their pile up place ma; either PBJ or L-C. If the student is using the barrel side of the mat they must sort the word into the correct barrel and if possible explain their choice by using the word correctly. Play moves to next student.


After all sticks have been picked up from the pile, all players add up their individual points based on the point value chart. This gives them their TOTAL SCORE for the game. By using the point value chart method, the winner is not necessarily determenined by the player with the most sticks.


OPTIONS: Increase the point values as students become more proficient in Semple Math or hide the point values until the game is over and reveal them at that point.


HINT: Make sure the various vowel patterns are not all written on the same color of stick. I like to give my students the sticks to sort for an independent activity and all the "oa" words are on yellow sticks, then they don't have to read the words they just sort them by colors. Small pencil boxes make great game container.

Pile Up Mat Directions:

Copy the masters onto one piece of card stock making it into a two sided page. Make one mat for each student. Laminate.

Usage Suggestions:

After the student has a turn to pick up a stick and read the word, the student then sorts the stick by placing in of them. They may decide which side to display or the teacher may assign which on another aspect of the word they just read.

Other uses may include:

- Independent activity for the student to sort words from the card games.
- Two students can share one mat and draw vocabulary cards from a draw pile and sort them onto the appropriate category.
 - Play "Thumbs Up" by having the mat out on each student's desk while doing auditory discrimination activities from the Stevenson Spelling Manuals.
- Use dry erase markers to "Tally Mark" how many PBJ or L-C words they find in a ibrary book

Be creative to find additional uses for the laminated mat.
